
1. BI Biohazardous Work Policy – Medical Monitoring

- a. Prior to working with select BSL-2 pathogens, users are encouraged to take part in the McMaster Medical Monitoring program:

- b. It is the responsibility of the user's supervisor to ensure medical monitoring implementation.
- c. It is the responsibility of the user and PI to inform the BI Biological Research Technician of any biohazardous inventory that requires medical monitoring.
- d. The BI will communicate medical monitoring inventories to affected users, as needed.
